Spartanburg Diesel Release

Incident summary

- Date, time, location:
 - February 1, 2026, at 10 p.m. ET
 - Products (SE) Pipe Line Corporation, Spartanburg Station Facility
- At approximately 10:00 p.m. ET 2/1/26, Products (SE) Pipe Line Corporation's Spartanburg Station facility experienced a diesel release from one of its tanks in Spartanburg, South Carolina. The company was notified of the release through an alarm from its facility.
 - In response, the company shut down the tank and stopped the release. Some diesel fuel migrated into the nearby Four Mile Branch Creek.
 - No injuries or fire have been reported as a result of the incident.
 - The initial estimate of diesel released is approximately 20,000 gallons. As of 2/3/26, approximately 15,400 gallons have been recovered.
 - The company continues to work with state and federal agencies, and its spill response teams are actively working to recover the product.
 - Protective booms and absorbent material have been deployed.
 - The company is conducting air monitoring using handheld devices for live readings and collecting air samples for the safety of personnel and the public.
 - Cleanup operations continue at the site with the oversight of state and federal agencies.

Weather Conditions:

- Weather conditions have improved with temperatures in the mid 40's (Fahrenheit), including a light mist of non-frozen precipitation.

Current activity:

- Responders continue the removal of diesel/water mixture from the impacted area.
- Crews continue to maintain the hard boom while deploying and replacing sorbent boom to collect the diesel.
- Responders have deployed skimmers for additional diesel removal.
- Responders place recovered diesel/water mixture into a temporary storage tank where it will settle and separate, and volumes can be determined prior to appropriate disposal.

Quantities:

- The initial estimate of diesel fuel released is approximately 20,000 gallons. As of 2/3/26, approximately 15,400 gallons have been recovered.

Equipment & Personnel on site:

- Approximately 50 contractors and Kinder Morgan personnel
- 225 feet of hard boom
- 330 feet of soft absorbent boom
- 8 vacuum trucks

Wildlife:

- No impacts to wildlife.

Fishery Closure:

- No impacts to fisheries.
