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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: The time is now 7:20 p.m., on
3	Thursday, September 18th, 2025, and this public
4	hearing will now begin. The public hearing is
5	being held by the South Carolina Department of
6	Environmental Services, also known as SCDES, to
7	accept comments and supporting information on the
8	application submitted by Luck Stone Corporation to
9	mine gneiss at a site located on Old Post Road in
10	Cherokee County, approximately one mile northeast
11	of Macedonia, South Carolina.
12	As a formal proceeding, the purpose of this
13	hearing is to accept oral comments from the
14	audience and record them for the official record.
15	Therefore, a SCDES staff will not be responding to
16	questions or comments during the hearing. A
17	written transcript will be prepared by the
18	certified court reporter, the transcript will serve
19	as the official record of this public hearing and
20	will be posted on the Department's web page when
21	available. The web page address is
22	des.sc.gov/luckstonecherokee, and it will be
23	updated with information as it becomes available.
24	Again, my name is Catherine Sawyer, and I will
25	serve as your hearing officer tonight. Thank you

1 for taking the time to be here for this important 2 step in SCDES's permitting process. 3 Before I go over how we will proceed, there are a couple of items that I would like to address. 4 5 First, I would ask that you please silence your cell phones or other electronic devices so that 6 7 others are not disturbed during the hearing. 8 if you have not already done so, I encourage each 9 of you to sign the attendance sheet located at the sign-in table so that we have a complete record of 10 11 everyone here tonight. We've asked for your 12 mailing or email address on the sign-in sheet so 13 that we know how to notify you of future 14 information regarding the proposed quarry. 15 The permitting process at SCDES begins when an 16 application is received for one or more 17 environmental permits. During this process, an applicant must show that its proposed operation can 18 19 comply with all applicable state and federal These regulations have been written 20 regulations. to ensure that human health and the environment are 21 22 protected. In addition to reviewing the 23 application, the Department's role is to write and, if issued, enforce permits that meet the 24 25 requirements and regulations.

You also have a role in SCDES's permitting 1 2 That's what brings us here tonight, to process. 3 receive your comments, formally, for the record. Although final permit decision cannot be made based 4 5 on a vote or how many people say the same thing, your comments are important and may influence the 6 terms and conditions written in the permit, if one 7 8 is issued. Comments and concerns given here 9 tonight, as well as those submitted in writing by the end of the public comment period, are welcomed 10 11 and encouraged. 12 A presentation on the proposed mine and DES's 13 permitting process was provided by Colby Myers and 14 Nick Hoehn during the public meeting held at 6 p.m. 15 This presentation will be made available on our web 16 page before the end of the public comment period. We'll now move on to the order in which we 17 will proceed with this hearing. A brief statement 18 19 about the proposed mine will be read for the record 20 by Colby Myers, and an overview of the draft air 21 permit will be read by Nick Hoehn. I will then 22 begin the public comment portion of the evening by 23 calling on those of you who indicated on the sign-in sheet that you would like to make a 24 25 If you have decided that you no longer comment.

1	wish to comment when you're called upon, you may
2	decline at that time. Once everyone has had a
3	chance to speak, I will ask if anyone else in
4	attendance would like to make a comment. After all
5	comments have been heard, I'll make closing
6	remarks, and the public hearing will be adjourned.
7	For everyone to have a fair and equal
8	opportunity to participate tonight and to ensure
9	that we proceed in a timely and effective manner,
10	the following four guidelines have been
11	established. No questions will be answered during
12	the public hearing. Your comments should not go
13	over three minutes for individuals or five minutes
14	for elected officials and those speaking on behalf
15	of an organized group. I will remind you if you do
16	not conclude your comments in that time. If you're
17	unable to present all of your comments within the
18	allotted time, please remember that you may submit
19	them to SCDES in writing by the close of the public
20	comment period.
21	Please be respectful towards anyone speaking
22	here tonight. You each have a unique, valued
23	perspective. No one comment is considered more
24	important than another. And please don't interrupt
25	or ask other participants to respond to your

1	comments. Should any comments or actions begin to
2	move away from the intent of this hearing, I may
3	ask the speaker to limit their statements and be
4	seated.
5	I will now call on Colby Myers to read a brief
6	statement about the mine operating permit.
7	MR. MYERS: On May 9th, 2025, Luck Stone Corporation
8	submitted a mine operating permit application to
9	mine gneiss in Cherokee County. The total
10	permitted area is proposed to be 347.6 acres,
11	consisting of 253.3 acres of affected area, 94.3
12	acres of buffer, and no future reserves. The
13	reclamation plan proposes to reclaim the site as a
14	pond or lake and grasslands.
15	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Now, we'll ask Nick Hoehn to
16	read a brief statement about the draft air permit.
17	MR. HOEHN: Luck Stone Corporation-Luck Cherokee, has
18	applied to the Department for an air construction
19	permit to install and operate a new gneiss
20	aggregate mine and processing plant. The draft
21	permit and draft statement of basis has been
22	written, which outlines the proposed project and
23	applicable regulations. This permit will enable
24	the facility to construct and operate in compliance
25	with federal and state air quality regulations.

1	The permit includes federally enforceable
2	facility-wide limits to remain below the major
3	source thresholds for both Title V Operating Permit
4	and prevention of significant deterioration of
5	regulations. The limits are less than 250 tons per
6	year of particulate matter emissions and less than
7	100 tons per year of particulate matter emissions
8	less than 10 microns.
9	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: As we transition to the comment
10	portion of this public hearing, I would like to
11	reiterate that SCDES staff are here to listen to
12	your comments. Answers or responses to questions
13	will not be provided tonight. All comments made
14	during this hearing are being recorded. If you're
15	unable to complete your comments in the
16	three-minute allotted time, you may submit them in
17	writing through the end of the public comment
18	period on October 3rd, 2025.
19	We will now hear from those of you who
20	indicated on the sign-in sheet that you would like
21	to make a comment. You will be called upon in
22	random order. Please clearly state and spell your
23	name for the court reporter before you begin
24	speaking. And I'm going to have you come down and
25	use this microphone.

1	So the first up is Dennis or Linda Sentell?
2	MR. SENTELL: My name is Dennis Sentell, D-e-n-n-i-s
3	S-e-n-t-e-l-l. I've lived in that Macedonia
4	community for seventy-two years. I don't think by
5	stopping the rock quarry is going to leave
6	Macedonia or Cherokee County in the dust. I don't
7	know what has been promised folks or the county. I
8	don't know how this quarry is going to impact our
9	community or county, other than having problems
10	with air, water, and noise. We've lived here for -
11	- for a long time. And I just don't want our
12	peaceful little community to become a noise and
13	water and air pollution area. Thank you.
14	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: All right. Next up is, Frannie
15	Stockwell? Would you like to make a comment
16	tonight?
17	(No response.)
18	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: All right. Jeff Dugan? No?
19	(No response.)
20	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Julia Humphries?
21	(No response.)
22	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Gail Humphries?
23	(No response.)
24	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Terry Manning? Okay. Please,
25	state and spell your name for the court reporter.

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1	MR. MANNING: For the record, my name is Terry Manning,
2	T-e-r-r-y M-a-n-n-i-n-g. As a native of Gaffney,
3	South Carolina, and as a resident of the Macedonia
4	Community, I am concerned about Luck Stone or
5	Luck Cherokee's commitment to maintain the beauty
6	of our community, the health and well-being of the
7	project's neighbors and their properties, and what
8	some have described as the inevitability of further
9	commercial development in this area.
10	We are not resistant to all change. Change is
11	inevitable. What we are resistant to is change
12	that threatens what we have enjoyed, and committed
13	to preserving for our family, both now and in the
14	future.
15	Even a cursory review appears to show that
16	there have been some issues with the application
17	process. These issues have raised questions, and I
18	hope that the applicant, and state officials
19	understand how this has tainted the perception of
20	this entry into our area. If they can be
21	addressed, I hope that they are addressed
22	adequately and with understanding that, when you
23	start off on the wrong foot, it's hard to get back
24	on the right foot. Thank you.
25	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Next, I'd like to call Emily

1 Holbert? No? 2 (No response.) 3 HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Gayle White? 4 (No response.) 5 HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Sloan Sentell? (No response.) 6 7 HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Okay. Timothy Daniel? 8 (No response.) 9 HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: All right. Lee Byers? No? 10 (No response.) 11 HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: All right. Dave Hoover? 12 (No response.) 13 HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Angie Peeler? 14 MS. PEELER: My name is Angie Peeler, A-n-g-i-e 15 P-e-e-l-e-r, and I'm very concerned about this, and 16 I'm concerned for the quality of the water. I'm concerned for the quality of our property. 17 18 something goes wrong, our property values just go 19 down, and who's going to fix that? I'm worried that we've had this land forever, that was to be 20 21 passed from generation to generation, and it's 22 going to be spoiled. And I'm worried about the sound pollution. And that's all I have. 23 24 you. 25 HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Shawn Peeler?

4	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Kathryn Kosloski?
5	MS. KOSLOSKI: My name is Kathryn, K-a-t-h-r-y-n,
6	Kosloski, K-o-s-l-o-s-k-i, and I, again, represent
7	Luck Companies. As a hundred-year-old family owned
8	and operated business, we have an immense amount of
9	respect for the level of history and pride that you
10	each take in your community. We hope, if we have
11	the ability to join this community, to be active,
12	engaged, and transparent member of your beloved
13	homes.
14	We acknowledge that an application like ours
15	takes an immense amount of trust, and we are
16	committed to earning that trust on a daily basis,
17	from the time the permit is applied to our hopeful
18	joining of the community. And we hope to do that
19	by meeting not only the federal, state, and local
20	regulatory expectations, but we hope to also exceed
21	those expectations, as well as most importantly,
22	exceeding your expectations as our neighbors and
23	community members.
24	I hope that if you leave here tonight with
25	additional questions, that you reach out to a

1	member of our team. And I'm here to share my
2	contact information with you. Again, my name is
3	Katy Kosloski or Kathryn Kosloski. My phone number
4	is (804)400-2591. And my email address is my first
5	initial and last name,
6	K-K-o-s-l-o-s-k-i@luckcompanies.com. I'm happy to
7	come down and sit and share more information with
8	each of you or invite you to tour one of our active
9	operations here in South Carolina or across the
10	southeast.
11	Thank you so much for your time and your
12	feedback, and thank you to DES for their thorough
13	consideration of our application.
14	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: That concludes everyone who
15	signed up to make a comment. Please raise your
16	hand if you've not had the opportunity to speak,
17	but would like to do so now. All right. It looks
18	like I've called on everyone.
19	Whoops. Whoops. I didn't see you. Come on.
20	Come on down and please state and spell your name
21	for the court reporter.
22	MS. JONES: I didn't sign to speak. My name is Mary
23	Knuckles Jones. M-a-r-y K-n-u-c-k-l-e-s, Jones,
24	J-o-n-e-s. I'm here to speak on behalf of the
25	Macedonia and Shady Grove communities. And we

1	are have been long residents of this community.
2	We were not or I was not made aware of this
3	initiative that has already taken hold, taken root.
4	I just happened to be reading the newspaper, maybe
5	a month or so ago, about these [sic] meeting
6	about what was going on with the and there was
7	going to be a quarry in our neighborhood, and I
8	just couldn't believe that.
9	I think about I don't know how many of you
10	are familiar with Limestone Quarry that was located
11	at Limestone College, thousands of miles deep,
12	filled with water, and took so many in drownings
13	over the years. But I also want I'm concerned
14	about the noise. I'm concerned about the
15	atmosphere. I'm concerned about this thing that
16	may or may not come into our community. But I
17	assume that once it's here, if it is here, and if
18	we have anything to say about it, it will be here
19	for 50 years. I see we can't ask questions, so I'm
20	making that statement. I'm not sure if that
21	whether it's true or not, but apparently, once it's
22	here, it's here. We're stuck with the and I
23	personally do not want this in our community. How
24	is it going I don't know how it's going to
25	profit Cherokee County. We'll have some more

1	walking trails, and some more another lake to
2	fish in. What I'd like to know the provision,
3	and I've tried to record all of those websites and
4	all those email addresses. I don't know if it
5	this may be a done deal, I don't know. But if it
6	is, I'm very sorry. Thank you.
7	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Is there anyone else who would
8	like to make a comment tonight? Okay. State and
9	spell your name for us, okay?
10	MS. HUMPHRIES: I sure will. My name is Julia
11	Humphries, J-u-l-i-a H-u-m-p-h-r-i-e-s. I want to
12	say for our community and for Cherokee County, I
13	have the same concerns that you guys do. I grew
14	up, from a baby, right next door to where this is
15	going to be. I do hope, as I'm sure everyone
16	hopes, that this will be held to a standard just
17	like anything else is in our community.
18	I work in healthcare, and you could not we
19	can't just let the place fall all to you know,
20	and have the accrediting bodies and come in and
21	say, "Hold on a minute." You know? That's a lot
22	of this checks and balances. That's why the I'm
23	still going to call you "DHEC" is here. So I think
24	that what I've been taught is to place my trust in
25	those agencies and hope that they'll follow through

1	and do their due diligence for our community.
2	I just I wanted to just say that, but I do
3	have the same concerns, but I do believe that
4	they're going to uphold to those standards.
5	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Would anyone else like to make
6	a comment?
7	MS. JONES: Can we make a second comment?
8	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: I think we have time for that,
9	yes, ma'am.
10	MS. JONES: My husband says no.
11	HEARING OFFICER SAWYER: Okay. Then since no other
12	attendees would like to speak, the comment portion
13	of tonight's public hearing is concluded. On
14	behalf of the South Carolina Department of
15	Environmental Services, I'd like to thank everyone
16	for coming here tonight and giving us your
17	comments. Please note, once again, that written
18	comments may be submitted to SCDES through October
19	3rd, 2025. All written comments received on or
20	before this date will be considered in SCDES's
21	decision-making process.
22	If you have questions about submitting written
23	comments after tonight, please see a staff member
24	before you leave. SCDES's Bureau of Land and Waste
25	Management will review and consider all comments

1	received and may request additional information
2	from the applicant if necessary. A decision will
3	then be made to approve or deny the mine permit
4	application and the mine operating permit.
5	Once a final decision is made, SCDES will
6	provide a summary response to all comments
7	received. The permit decision and summary response
8	will be provided to everyone who signed in here
9	tonight, as well as those who submitted comments
10	during the public comment period. The final permit
11	decision and summary response will also be posted
12	on the web page. You will receive notification of
13	SCDES's permit decision by standard U.S. mail or by
14	email. If you wish to be notified of the final
15	decision by certified mail instead, please make
16	your request known in writing no later than October
17	3rd of 2025. If you have questions or if you're
18	interested in discussing specific aspects of the
19	proposed mine, please reach out to any of our staff
20	members. We will be happy to begin a conversation
21	with you.
22	On behalf of the South Carolina Department of
23	Environmental Services, thank you again for your
24	attendance and comments this evening. The time is
25	now 7:42 p.m., and the public hearing is officially

1	adjourned.
