BE BATTERY SMART

IT'S GOOD TO BE A KNOW-IT-ALL

Got a tablet, laptop, hand-held video game, smart watch, or cell phone?

Rechargeable lithium-ion (Li-ion) batteries supply power to all of those devices and more.

If improperly charged, stored, used, thrown away, or recycled, these batteries can catch fire or explode.



Always follow the manufacturer's instructions. Different devices may have different requirements.

Never charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.

Don't overcharge devices or leave them charging overnight. Unplug them once they are fully charged.

Don't use batteries that are swollen, leaking, dented, or show other signs of damage.

Do not place rechargeable batteries in your household garbage or recycling cart. Recycle properly.
