Meeting Summary

The meeting was called to order at 11 am, with Scott Harder welcoming the RBC members. Scott shared background information on the RBC process noting that the Santee Basin River Plan will need to be developed in about 10 months. Scott introduced John Boyer of CDM Smith as the lead facilitator.

John Boyer reviewed the meeting objectives, introduced members of the Planning Team, and allowed each of the RBC members to introduce themselves and discuss their interest in serving on the RBC.

John provided the opportunity for public and agency comment. No comments were offered.

Scott Harder provided an overview of the history of water planning in the state and the progression to the current water planning framework and the recent formation of the WaterSC Working Group. He described the eight river basins in the state and why the state adopted a bottom-up approach that encourages stakeholder engagement and participation. Scott described the five-step process of water planning in the planning framework and noted that the groundwater assessment models would not be available during the first iteration of planning. He drew attention to the 50-year planning horizon and the emphasis on identifying the potential for water shortages under drought conditions. Scott noted the status of the other river basin plans, as well as the overall state water plan.

John Boyer discussed the questions that the river basin plans are intended to address, which focus on identifying (1) currently available water supply and demands, (2) the total amount of permitted and registered withdrawals, (3) the ability to meet all water demands over the 50-year planning horizon, and (4) management strategies needed to meet demands. John gave examples of strategies recommended in other basins – such as water reuse. He reminded the members of the guiding principles, which include acknowledging that water is a finite essential resource that needs to be made available to users and shared equitably while ensuring sustainability.

John gave an overview of the RBC roles/responsibilities and how to elect a chair/vice-chair. He recommended electing a chair/vice-chair by the 2nd or 3rd meeting. Brooke Czwartacki discussed the major water features of the Santee River basin. She presented data from historical figures of water supply and demand in the basin. She introduced the Simplified Water Allocation Model (SWAM) will be used to evaluate multiple demand scenarios and noted that although no groundwater modeling will be performed in this phase, groundwater withdrawal data and groundwater demand projections will be

used to inform groundwater recommendations. John followed up Brooke by discussing the four phases of the planning process.

John Boyer reviewed the RBC Bylaws and discussed how the RBC will operate. He emphasized the importance of identifying an alternate and noted that alternates are welcome to attend all meetings. In the interest of time, the discussion on specific term member lengths was tabled until the next meeting.

A breakout session was held to discuss basin priorities. The RBC members divided into three groups and after some time for discussion, reported back to the full RBC. Numerous priorities were identified, including but not limited to knowing how limited the basin is in terms of supply, protecting groundwater resources, ensuring equitable use of water, and promoting a water conservation ethic.

To close the meeting, it was decided that future meetings will be held on the second Tuesday of each month, except for January, beginning at 9 am and ending by 1 pm. For January, the meeting will be held on January 28th, 2025, at the same facility - Old Santee Canal Park's Learning Center.
