Dear Concerned Citizen,

Thank you for your interest and/or comments regarding the applications from the above referenced facility for the three air quality permits as follows:

- CP-50000051 v1.0 to incorporate limits and requirements into a federally enforceable permit;
- CP-50000175 v1.0 to install new equipment for discontinuing the practice of adding solids to the clarifier; and
- CP-50000061 v1.0 to install and operate a new low-pressure (LP) steam foul condensate stripper system and make corresponding changes to existing equipment and treatment scenarios

Be advised that South Carolina Department of Environmental Services ("SCDES") has made a decision regarding each of the above-referenced permits after consideration and complete review of the following: the permit application, applicable state and federal air quality regulations, comments made at the public hearing held on June 13, 2024, all comments received within the required time frame, the public hearing transcripts, and all other pertinent information. All comments received were reviewed for technical merit and have been included in SCDES's permanent record for this facility.

SCDES has issued the following decisions on July 22, 2024:

- Issuance of CP-50000051 v1.0;
- Issuance of CP-50000175 v1.0; and
- Issuance of CP-50000061 v1.0.

S.C. Code Ann. § 48-6-30(D)(2) provides: "Within thirty calendar days after the mailing of a decision [pursuant to S.C. Code Ann.§ 48-6-30(D)(1)], an applicant, permittee, licensee, certificate holder, or affected person desiring to contest the department decision may request a contested case hearing before the Administrative Law Court, in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act."
