AT ANDERSON COUNTY CONVENIENCE CENTERS?

ALUMINUM CANS
(Rinse. Do not flatten.)



PLASTIC BOTTLES & JUGS
(Rinse. Leave caps on.)



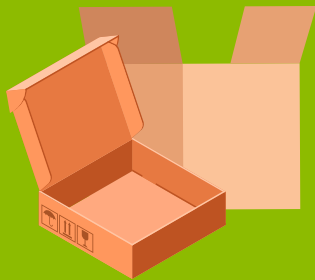
MIXED PAPER
(e.g., newspaper, magazines; Shredded paper should be bagged.)



PAPERBOARD
(e.g., cereal boxes, shoe boxes; Flatten.)



CARDBOARD
(Flatten.)



HOUSEHOLD ELECTRONICS
(e.g., computers, laptops, monitors, TVs, printers, cell & landline phones)



COOKING OIL



STEEL CANS
(Rinse.)



USED MOTOR OIL, BOTTLES & FILTERS



GLASS BOTTLES, JARS & JUGS
(e.g., clear, green, brown; Remove caps.)



TIRES
(Accepted ONLY at the Materials Recovery Facility, 104 Landfill Road, Belton)



ANTIFREEZE



NOTE: All recyclables must be sorted now.

RECYCLING'S DIRTY DOZEN



THESE **12 ITEMS ARE NOT ACCEPTED** FOR RECYCLING
AT ANDERSON COUNTY CONVENIENCE CENTERS

1 

PLASTIC BAGS

Recycle these at your local grocery store or food bank.

2 

BAGGED ITEMS

Don't bag recycled items. Keep them loose in your bin.

3 

SHREDDED PAPER

It can become litter or jam equipment at the recycling facility.

4 

SYRINGES

They can hurt workers. Dispose of properly. Visit www.scdhec.gov.

5 

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Recycle them at a county drop-off center.

6 

GREASE-STAINED CARDBOARD

Dirty pizza boxes can not be recycled.

7 

UNRECYCLABLE PLASTIC

See if it is accepted in your program first.

8 

NO GLASS OR GLASS BOTTLES

Reuse them or buy items in plastic instead.

9 

FOOD & LIQUIDS

Empty and rinse containers that can be recycled.

10 

UNRECYCLABLE GLASS

Don't recycle dishes, bulbs or windows.

11 

ROPE-LIKE ITEMS

Hoses, wire and string lights jam sorting equipment.

12 

BIO-HAZARDOUS WASTE

Diapers and pet waste can make workers sick.
