To Mr. Frazier:

According to our records, you are listed as the owner of Millers Pond Dam – D 2133. Based on a visual assessment of your dam following the recent flooding, it was noted that your dam is damaged and repairs and/or maintenance are needed to ensure that your dam is in compliance with the South Carolina Dams and Reservoirs Act, S.C. Code Ann. 49-11-110, et seq., and Regulation 72-1, et seq.

Your dam, including spillways and all appurtenances, must be inspected by a South Carolina licensed professional engineer to assess the dam and identify any necessary repairs and/or maintenance. An inspection report of the assessment, including findings and recommendations, must be submitted by the engineer to the Department by **November 25, 2016**, or a request for an extension should be submitted prior to that date. An application for a permit to make repairs (including any repairs that have already been made) or to alter/remove the dam must accompany the inspection report. The permit application is enclosed. The application, along with other relevant information, can also be found at <http://www.scdhec.gov/environment/WaterQuality/DamsReservoirs/DamsPermitting/>.

If your dam is currently impounding water, lower the water level of the reservoir as much as possible within 14 days of receiving this letter. If your dam is not currently impounding water, ensure that impoundment does not occur until your permit application is submitted and approved.
