<b>Type of program</b>	Requires television/monitor manufacturers to recycle 80% of their market share by weight every program year.  Other CED manufacturers must have a takeback program available for consumers.	Uses consumer fees on certain electronic devices to pay for authorized collectors who provide a free avenue to recycled electronic waste.	The state calculates a recycling goal and CED manufacturers must pay for the implementation or they can opt-out and implement their own program which recycles their calculated obligation.	The state uses a "convenience standard." Manufacturers must either offer or participate in a "clearinghouse" that offers a plan that financially supports a specific number of sites or events in all counties that wish to participate.

<b>Recycling standard/target</b>	Pounds Target (TVs/Monitors) - Manufacturers must recycle 80% of their market share by weight every program year.	N/A	Pounds Target - The State calculates the recycling goal for each program year and manufacturers must either financially support or make their own plan to cover their market share of the year's recycling goal.	Convenience Standard - Manufacturers must financially support a specific number of sites in all counties that elect to participate in their program.
